APPLICATION SUBMISSION + PROCESS

HOW TO SUBMIT YOUR APPLICATION

- 1. Prepare your submission (use the checklist on pg 6)
- 2. Go to www.sasustainability.com to fill out the application
- 3. Good Luck! We will contact grant awardees by June 10

OUR REVIEW PROCESS

The Scoring Committee will review and evaluate each proposal and contact you with any questions. The Office of Sustainability and the City reserve the right, solely at its discretion, to:

- Refuse any application or any grant, in whole or in part, for any reason.
- Require additional information from the applicant prior to making a decision.
- If the completed work does not meet the intent of the original project application and award of funds, the applicant will be required to return any funds disbursed.

WHEN YOU ARE SELECTED

You will be notified by June 10th if your project proposal has been accepted and invited to a kick-off event on Jun 26th. (More details to follow) If your project is selected for funding, you will meet with the Office of Sustainability staff to complete paperwork for processing.

NEXT STEPS TO MAXIMIZE YOUR GRANT'S IMPACT

Upcoming milestones, what to expect, and how the Office of Sustainability will maintain contact with grantees after grants are awarded.

- Submit final report 30 days following project completion, including:
 - Final metrics
 - Photo or video documentation of the project
 - A final report template will be provided (template to be provided)
 - This report requires documentation of expenses (Example: Scanned copies of all expense receipts.)
 - If the completed work does not meet the intent of the original project application and award of funds, the applicant will be required to return any funds disbursed.
